
The Museum As A Community Park

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The museum itself is divided into differing and contrasting parts. The main hall and reception is a solid natural stone structure, which rises out of the plot. Glass bridges link it with smaller buildings, galleries containing exhibits, along with workshop spaces and an amphitheatre. These enclosed spaces complement the otherwise fluid circulation of visitors through corridors and plazas. These public spaces, offering both light and shade, offer an arena for artists to engage with an audience and a realm for community interaction.
